

## Landscapes en Plein Air

You are welcome to purchase new materials for this class, but please feel free to bring any materials you may already have on-hand, especially if you are on a budget.

## **Materials:**

<u>Sketchbook</u> – Inexpensive sketchbook or drawing pad 6" x 8" or larger (feel free to bring a sketchbook you've already started)

<u>Drawing Pencil</u> – HB (I recommend Tombow Mono pencils, but any brand will do! You may also want to bring a portable pencil sharpener)

<u>Oil Paint Essentials</u>- I prefer M. Graham brand Paint, but feel free to bring paint you may have in other brands. This is a split primary palette of colors that will allow you to mix pretty much any color in nature.

- Titanium While
- Azo Yellow
- Indian Yellow
- Pyroll Red
- Alizarin Crimson
- Burnt Umber
- Ultramarine Blue
- Magnesium Blue Hue or Prussian Blue

Palette - Paper or glass Palette (9" x 12" or larger)

Palette Knife – RGM #20 or #21

Brushes – synthetic or hog bristle (Connoisseur brand recommended) Flat #6 and Filbert #6.

Red Sable round #0. Please feel free to bring any brushes you may already have.

**Solvent** – Gamsol (4 oz bottle or more), Silicoil jar, or other glass container with lid.

<u>Rags</u> – Soft Polishing cloths (found in many hardware stores) or paper towels. Old white t-shirts also work well.

<u>Panels</u> – (gessoboard, or mdf/hardboard that you've gessoed yourself) 6 or more panels, 6" x 8" or 8" x 10".

<u>Easel</u> – Portable standing easel or pochade box. (a google search for 'plein air setup' will give you a good idea of some available options.)

<u>Chair (Optional)</u> – you may want to bring a lightweight folding chair if you're not using a standing easel. <u>Table (Optional)</u> – if your easel or pochade box does not have resting space for your paint and palette, you may want to bring a small collapsible table to set up beside you that can hold these.

<u>Cleanup</u> – Masters Brush Cleaner and Preserver – plastic zip-lock or trash bags to hold used paint rags and other trash

<u>Food</u> – This is a 4 hour class, and you may want to bring lunch or snacks to eat during breaks from painting.
