Exploring Color

The supply list for this class is pretty open depending on which media you are most comfortable with. I know supplies for art classes can get expensive so I've tried to keep the list of supplies as cost-efficient as possible, and highly recommend just bringing what you have already where applicable!

- **9x12 Mixed Media or Watercolor sketchbook or paper pad**
 - I prefer sketchbooks because they keep everything in one place, but whatever you like to work on / in the most is fine, as long as you have paper that will work well with your chosen media!
 - A canvas paper pad is also a good option if you work in acrylic/oil paint
- **Paint in the following colors:** (acrylic, watercolor, gouache, and oil all work, use your favorite!)
 - **Primary Red**—I recommend Pyrrol or Cadmium Red Medium
 - **Primary Magenta**—usually just listed as magenta. Do not get Opera Pink or Fluorescent Pink !
 - **Primary Yellow**—Cadmium Yellow Medium is a good one
 - **Primary Blue**—Ultramarine Blue and Cobalt Blue are commonly good
 - **Primary Cyan**—usually just listed as Cyan, but if you need an alternative Manganese Blue or Cerulean Blue will work as well
- Watercolor
 - If you're purchasing watercolor, I recommend tubes over pans
- Oil
 - *If you choose to use oil paint, I expect that you already have experience working with it as a medium and know how to properly use and clean up after yourself. We will not be going over the intricacies of oil paint in the class, but you're welcome to use it if you like it!
- **Brushes**
 - MKAC has some if you would like to use ours
- **Palette**
 - I recommend a large, flat surface for this. You can purchase things like a butcher palette or a glass palette at an art supply store, or you can create your own glass palette.
 - I do not recommend palettes with multiple wells.

- *For watercolor painters, a white ceramic plate also works well
- **Palette Knife** for mixing paint (if using acrylic or oil)
 - Any shape will work, just find one that you like !
 - Plastic is fine but metal is better
- **Anything else you need to make your art!** We'll go over these supplies on the first day.
 - All media is welcome in this class, but as part of it is about color *mixing*, we will need to use paint for some of the exercises. In the later weeks of the class the projects are open to all media
- We will be using iPads during a couple weeks of the class but you do not need to purchase one for it. If you have your own you'd like to use, please make sure it has Procreate (\$9.99) already downloaded on it!
