



## Illustrative Painting Supply List

### Canvases

• 3 - 4 - 11"x14" and 16"x20" - You can purchase gessoed canvases which have a white paint, called gesso, already applied to the canvas. That will make it easy to begin painting right away. I suggest starting with 2- 11x14 canvases. If you complete those and would like to work larger, then you can purchase one more. Not everyone likes to work larger and some really want to, so it is what you feel most comfortable working with. **For beginning painters 11x14 is a good size.**

### Liquitex Basics Acrylic Paints

Purchase the smaller tubes to practice. You can buy larger sizes once you know that this medium is of interest to you. If the number of paints is too expensive, please buy the primaries (ultramarine, red medium, yellow medium) and white first.

- Titanium White
- Ultramarine Blue
- Hansa Yellow Medium Hue
- Yellow Ochre (optional earth tone yellow)
- Cadmium Red Medium
- Burnt Sienna

### Brushes

I like the Princeton Select brushes, they're inexpensive and decent quality. If this number of brushes is too expensive, please purchase Round 4, Flat Shader 6 at a minimum. Another option is a mixed bag of brushes from a craft store like Michael's.

- Round 2
- Round 4
- Round 6
- Flat Shader 8
- Flat Shader 4
- Angle Shader 1/2"

### Palette

Palettes help you organize small amounts of paint that you plan to use for your painting. You can purchase a plastic or metal palette — a simple plastic palette should work fine, or you can bring a plate from goodwill for mixing your paints. Plastic or glass should be good.

### Optional

- Acrylic paper (9x12) - You can purchase this if you want to, for warmup activities, testing colors, or small paintings done in preparation for a canvas painting.
