### Decoration Supplies

Each student will be expected to purchase their own decorations for their sketchbook as it helps add personal meaning and flair.

- 2-3 sheets of Decorative paper or book cloth at least 24 inches x 10 inches (enough to cover two covers 8.5 x 11 with 1 inch margins)
- Gluestick (for collage)
  - Transparent papers may show the cardboard, but if you are alright with that you are free to use them.

### Drawing Supplies

In this course, you will be allowed to use whatever mark making tools you would like in your sketchbook, but it should be something that you enjoy using regularly in your personal art practice. I'd encourage students to have at least a pencil and eraser on hand, but feel free to bring in any of the following supplies:

- Pencils (Graphite, Color, Watercolor)
- Water soluble paint or pigment (India Ink, Sumi Ink, Gouache, Watercolor, Tempera, Acrylic, etc.)
- Pens (felt tip, ballpoint, posca, etc)
- Collage materials (magazines, newspapers, personal photos, additional paper, doodles)
- Any other materials I forgot (as long as they are non toxic and don't require paint thinner or an outdoor/heavily ventilated setting to use)

\*Be warned that messy materials such as charcoal or pastel will easily rub off on pages without fixative or wax paper in between.

### Don't know what you like drawing with?

Beginner students who are still exploring what they like in art may not know what to bring, and so I have provided a diverse range of supplies below to assist those who are lost.

- Bring at least three of the following items off the list below (you do NOT have to buy everything):
  - Set of Artists Pencils (graphite) - HB, 2B, 4B, 2H, 4H etc. - \$10-15
  - Derwent Artist Pencils - Sepia (red), Terracotta, Ivory Black, Brown Ochre, Chocolate - \$3 per pencil
  - Erasers (please get these if you buy any set of graphite pencils) - any brand, white or pink is fine. I like the Pentel hi-polymer eraser. - \$5
  - Conte Crayons - Sketching Set of 4 - \$5
  - Pens - a permanent felt tip pen (like a sharpie), ball point pens (like Pilot) in black \$5-\$15
  - If you think you'll enjoy painting in a sketchbook, I recommend gouache because it's opaque, can dry fast, and is water soluble (making it relatively safe and portable). If this is you, buy "Winsor & Newton Designers' Gouache Primary Color 6-Tube Paint Set, 14ml" for ~\$30 online. Along with this you should bring a palette and at least 3-5 watercolor brushes of varying sizes and shapes. All of this should add up to ~\$50 in total.
